




Rational Choice Theory

Importance

Builds extensively on past literature to establish a mid-macro level model that analyzes voter turnout through all three of the paradigms

Base of Model

Voter decisions are the result of group cohesion, rather than individual acts. The logic of democracy thus works in an aggregate & not an individual level (Berelson, Lazarsfeld, & McPhee, 1954).

ELECTORAL CLEAVAGE

Definition

Historical inequalities that divide societies into groups

Structural Functionalism

Creates heterogeneity within society, which assures the presence of a plurality of ideas, thus keeping democracy alive (Lipset & Rokkan, 1967)

LAZARSFELD & BERELSON (2021): MAINTENANCE OF CLEAVAGE



Social Differentiation

Socioeconomic status, religion, race & community

Role: Precondition of cleavage



Transmissibility

Generational internalized mechanisms & ideologies

Role: Socialization, ensures persistence of cleavage



Proximity


Cohesion within groups & distance from opposants

Role: Determines agents of socialization & reactivation

Empirical components rooted in the social structure system is revealed when social divisions Structural Functionalism different levels Regulatory components that result in conflicting forms of social consciousness are felt in three **Conflict Paradigm** Link between Institutional components that are expressed in individual interactions Symbolic Interactionism



Macro-Level Sociology

Views voting tendencies as a national phenomenon

Recurring Cycles

Recurring period of 40 years where:

- 1- Social tensions ascend
- 2- They become too intense to ignore
- 3- System has a crisis
- 4- Realignment period (Burnham, 1984)

Political attitudes are epiphenomenal consequences of historical conflicts

In the US, elections are processes determined by the current struggle between the American Party System & Modern Capitalism

BURNHAM'S MODEL (1988)

Conflict Theory:

Elections are determined by current social conflicts

Symbolic Interactionism:

Society gives meaning to politicians, who they consider as "elites".

Structural Functionalism:

These social conflicts serve as a way to modernize political institution

Social Media & Globalization has bright faster communication

Consequences

Since the beginning of the 21st century, there has been a national bounce from blue to red to blue...

This has created an unforeseeable political and social instability (Muirhead & Tulis, 2020)



INSTITUTIONALIZED RACISM & VOTER SUPPRESSION



VOTER SUPPRESSION

Three-Fifths Compromise

Agreement between North & South States that slaves were worth % a person, repealed in 1868

Gerrymandering

Process in which district lines are drawn to dilute or suppress the democratic power of racial minorities

PERCENTAGE OF BLACK PEOPLE



"Redistricting is like an election in reverse! It's a great event. Usually, the voters get to pick the politicians. In redistricting, the politicians get to pick the voters!"

LAZARSFELD & BERELSON (2021): VOTER SUPPRESSION



Social Differentiation

Cleavage is based on race and socioeconomic status



Transmissibility

Generational internalized mechanisms & ideologies ensures persistence of cleavage



Proximity

Cohesion within groups & distance from opposant groups that enslaved them determines agents of socialization

Causal link between Gerrymandering & voter turnout: Discouraged to vote in a system that is against them (Blaskowsky, 2021)

TODAY...

Felon Voting Rights

By taking away felon's right to vote in certain states, they are furthering the targeting (The Power Elite, C. Wright Mills)

This disproportionately affects black voters (Gramlich, 2019)



Lack of representation

Lack of representation of racial minorities leads to POC voting less likely (Bailenson et al., 2008)
